

### **Solutions**

S1. Ans. (d)

Sol. Read someone the Riot Act:

To scold, reprimand, or reprove one severely for an error or mistake.

Hence, **option (d)** is the right answer choice.

S2. Ans. (e)

Sol. Winds of changes:

An event or series of events that signals or precipitates large and important changes. Hence, **option (e)** is the right answer choice.

S3. Ans. (c)

Sol. Take someone at face value:

To accept or trust someone or something based only on an initial or superficial prese ntation, without taking further proof, verification, or investigation into account. Hence, option (c) is the right answer choice.

S4. Ans. (a)

Sol. Keep one's end of the bargain:

To do as was promised in an agreement or bargain; to carry through with what one a greed to do.

Hence, **option (a)** is the right answer choice.

S5. Ans. (b)

Sol. Part Company: To separate or depart (from one); to stop associating (with one). Hence, option (b) is the right answer choice.

S6. Ans. (e)

Sol. Jump Ship:

to leave any post or position; to quit or resign, especially when there is difficulty Hence, option (e) is the right answer choice.

S7. Ans. (a)

Sol. On a collision course: If two persons/things are on a collision course or path, they end up colliding or coming into conflict with each other. Hence, option (a) is the right answer choice.

Sol. Come to terms with: To begin to or make an effort to understand, accept, and deal with a difficult or problematic person, thing, or situation.
