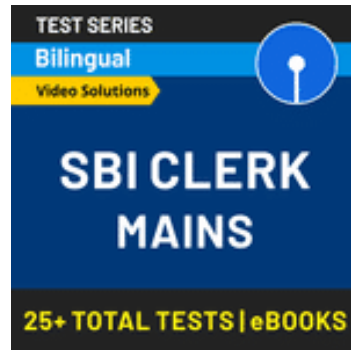

Solutions

S1. Ans. (b)

Sol. 'on tenterhooks' is a phrase which means 'in a state of suspense or agitation because of uncertainty about a future event.'

Among the given alternatives, (i) and (ii) imparts the correct meaning to the highlighted phrase.

Hence, the option (b) is the correct answer.

S2. Ans. (a)

Sol. The highlighted phrase '**cheek by jowl**' means 'close together'

Among the given alternatives, only alternative (i) impart the correct meaning to the highlighted phrase. Hence, the option (a) is the correct answer.

S3. Ans. (d)

Sol. The meaning of the highlighted phrase '**taken to task**' is 'To scold, reprimand, lecture, or hold one accountable for some wrong or error they committed'

Among the given alternatives, both alternative (i) and (iii) impart the correct meaning to the highlighted phrase.

Upbraided- find fault with (someone); scold

Hence, the option (d) is the correct answer.

S4. Ans. (b)

Sol. The phrase "a blind alley" means that someone is following a course of action that is certain to lead to an undesirable outcome. Therefore, only option (b) correctly illustrates the meaning of the given sentence.

Hence, it becomes the most suitable answer choice.

S5. Ans. (d)

Sol. The highlighted idiom "a lick and a promise" means a quick and careless act of cleaning or washing. All the other sentences are contextually different from the given sentence. Therefore, only option (d) correctly illustrates the meaning of the given sentence. Hence, it becomes the most suitable answer choice.

S6. Ans. (c)

Sol. The idiom "back to the drawing board" means to start planning something again because the first plan failed. All the other sentences are contextually different from the given sentence. Therefore, only option (c) correctly illustrates the meaning of the given sentence. Hence, it becomes the most suitable answer choice.

S7. Ans. (a)

Sol. The idiom "crying over spilt milk" means to express regret about something that has already happened or cannot be changed. All the other sentences are contextually different from the given sentence. Therefore, only option (a) correctly illustrates the meaning of the given sentence. Hence, it becomes the most suitable answer choice.

S8. Ans. (d)

Sol. The idiom "a far cry from" means be very different to. All the other sentences are contextually different from the given sentence. Therefore, only option (d) correctly illustrates the meaning of the given sentence.

Hence, it becomes the most suitable answer choice.

S9. Ans. (a)

Sol. The sentence is describing about the fluctuations in the price of oil barrel. Therefore, the words 'prescriptions' and 'shortcomings' are incorrect in the context of the paragraph. Hence, they should be replaced by 'perceptions' and 'shortage'. 'Perceptions' means the way in which something is regarded, understood, or interpreted. 'Shortage' means a state or situation in which something needed cannot be obtained in sufficient amounts. Hence, option (a) is the most suitable answer choice.

S10. Ans. (c)

Sol. The sentence is describing about a smart device which was invented before computers, which was built by Wolfgang von Kempelen. Therefore, the word “discovered” which means be the first to find or observe (a place, substance, or scientific phenomenon) is incorrect and should be replaced by “invented” which means create or design (something that has not existed before); be the originator of. All the other highlighted words are grammatically and contextually correct. Hence, option (c) is the correct answer choice.

S11. Ans. (d)

Sol. The sentence is describing about a leadership program for the Aspiring Principals. It has also mentioned its areas of interests to work on. To frame a grammatically correct sentence, replace “over” with “rather” as “rather than” indicates that something is done in place of something else. “emphasis” should be replaced by “emphasizes” as the subject [The Aspiring Principals Leadership program] of the verb is singular. Moreover, “progressive” should be replaced by “progress” as progressive is an adjective which means happening or developing gradually or in stages while ‘progress’ is a noun which means forward or onward movement towards a destination. Hence, option (d) is the most suitable answer choice.

S12. Ans. (a)

Sol. The sentence is describing about the services provided by the Anganwadi centres. Services are rendered or delivered but cannot be distributed. To frame a grammatically correct and contextually meaningful paragraph, replace “distribution” which means the action of sharing something out among a number of recipients by “delivery” which means the supply or provision of something. All the other highlighted words are correct, hence, option (a) is the most suitable answer choice.

S13. Ans. (b)

Sol. The word “pray” which means address a prayer to God or another deity is incorrect and must be replaced by “prey” to form a contextually meaningful sentence. “prey” means someone who can be easily deceived or harmed. All the other highlighted words are correct, hence, option (b) is the most suitable answer choice.

S14. Ans. (b)

Sol. The sequence 1-4 makes a coherent and contextually meaningful sentence.

In the sentence 1-4, there is an error in the part (B) of the sentence.

‘The’ should be used before ‘values’ because in the ‘Noun + of + Noun’ construction, ‘the’ is used prior to the noun appearing prior to the ‘of’.

S15. Ans. (c)

Sol. The sequences 1-5 and 3-4 would make coherent and contextually meaningful sentences.

In the sentence 1-5, there is an error in the part (C) of the sentence.

‘The’ shouldn’t be used prior to ‘college’. In the phrases like ‘go to school/church/jail’, the words ‘school, college, church, jail etc.’ are fulfilling their fundamental objectives.

In the sentence 3-4, there is an error in the part (C) of the sentence.

Instead of ‘was’, ‘were’ would be used because the subject of the verb is ‘those players’ which is a plural noun.

Hence, option (c) is the correct answer.

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
