61. (2); Refer to the second paragraph of the passage.
62. (4); Refer to the last line of the first paragraph, the second paragraph and the last line of the passage.
63. (3); "Though crushed, it reminded the British vividly that they were a tiny ethnic group who could not rule a gigantic subcontinent without the support of important locals"
64. (1); "The white man's burden came up as a new moral rationale for conquest. It was supposedly for the good of the conquered"
65. (3); Refer to the fifth paragraph of the passage.
66. (5); **proclaim**
Meaning- to announce officially or publicly. So, deny is the word which is opposite in meaning to it.
67. (5); **debtor**
Meaning- a person who owes a creditor. So, mortgagee is the word which is opposite in meaning to it.
68. (3); **hypocrisy**
Meaning- pretending to have qualities or beliefs that you do not have. So, honesty is the word which is opposite in meaning to it.
69. (1); **imperialism**
Meaning- a policy of extending your rule over foreign countries. So, development is the word which is similar in meaning to it.
70. (1); **fresh**
Meaning- recently made, produced, or harvested. So, new is the word which is similar in meaning to it.
71. (4); Replace 'untrustworthy and corruption' with 'untrustworthy and corrupt'.
72. (1); Replace 'Systematic and carefully' with 'Systematic and careful'.
73. (5); No correction required.
74. (2); Replace 'Mere being equipped with' with 'Merely being equipped with'.
75. (3); Replace 'Rank high in the appraisal of' with 'rank high by the appraisal of'.
71. (2); Change 'received' to 'receive' as did is followed by first form of verb instead of second form of verb when used in past tense.
72. (4); Change 'wisest' to 'wise' as when two qualities of a noun or a pronoun are compared with each other, **more + positive degree** is used instead of a comparative degree.

73. (3); Change 'on' with 'at' as at is used to indicate place.
74. (4); Change 'weaken' into 'weakens' as singular subject (market) must be followed by singular verb (weakens).
75. (3); Replace 'which' with 'who' as 'who' is used for people whereas 'which' is used for things.
