- So, establish firmly is the word which is similar in meaning to it.

**Meaning-** made denser or more concise. So, expanded is the word which is opposite in meaning to it.

**Meaning-** of great importance. So, trivial is the word which is opposite in meaning to it.

**Meaning-** the refusal to accept or comply with something. So, acceptance is the word which is opposite in meaning to it.
