






#### THE HINDU REVIEW: OCTOBER 2016 for KVS, NVS, Army Public School Exam, DSSSB

- ♣ The EU and Canada signed a free trade deal 2016 that was almost derailed last week by objections from Frenchspeaking Belgians , exposing the difficulties of securing agreement from 28 member states as Britain prepares for Brexit talks.
- Prime Minister NarendraModi has inaugurated Chhattisgarh's 16th foundation day celebrations in Naya Raipur. Chhattisgarh Governor B D Tandon and Chief Minister Raman Singh are also present at the site.
- Rishi Jaitly, Twitter's India head who helped popularise the adoption of the micro-blogging website
- among government departments to respond to citizen queries, has quit the company.
- ♣ Kerala has become the third Open Defecation Free (ODF) state in the country. The announcement was made on the state's foundation day on 01st November, 2016. Earlier, Himachal Pradesh and Sikkim had declared themselves Open Defecation Free.
- State-run NHPC has announced commissioning of a 50 MW wind power project in Rajasthan. NHPC has commissioned its 50 MW wind power project in Jaisalmer, Rajasthan.
- The Centre notified the rules for Real Estate Act, that seeks to regulate the housing sector besides bringing transparency and ensuring timely completion of projects, which will be applicable for five Union Territories-The Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Chandigarh, Dadra and Nagar Haveli, Daman and Diu, and Lakshadweep.
- With several high-ticket alleged frauds like Vijay Mallya loan default case coming to fore, Central
- ♣ Vigilance Commission has now made it mandatory for the public sector banks to report to it all such matters involving funds over Rs one crore.
- The finance ministry released first installment of special assistance of Rs 1,093.34 crore for repair and permanent restoration of damaged public buildings in Jammu and Kashmir in pursuance of the announcement made by the Prime Minister last November. A total sum of Rs 2,000 crore has been provided for permanent restoration of damaged Infrastructure such as schools, colleges, hospitals, bus stations and other critical public infrastructure under Prime Minister Reconstruction Plan for J&K.
- India and Palestine signed a MoU for setting up a Palestine-India Techno Park in Ramallah, Palestine. During the visit of President Pranab Mukherjee to Palestine in October last year, the announcement for

- setting up of park was made. India has announced a grant of \$12 million for setting up the park with payment of \$3 million each on half-yearly basis for two years.
- ♣ Prime Minister NarendraModi has launched the "Saur SujalaYojana" in Chhattisgarh that would provide solar powered irrigation pumps to farmers at a subsidized price.
- ➡ Team India's limited-overs cricket skipper Mahendra Singh Dhoni remains the most valued Indian athlete in 2016, despite a drop in his brand value when compared with last year, shows the Forbes Fab 40 list released recently.
- The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) tightened rules for credit rating agencies, prescribing more disclosures on suspension and withdrawal of ratings. The capital markets regulator also directed agencies to disclose the nature of their compensation arrangements with rated entities, including exchange of gifts.
- Sushil Chandra on 01st November 2016 took over as Chairman of the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT). Chandra, an Indian Revenue Service (IRS) officer of the 1980 batch, comes in place of Rani Singh Nair, who retired from service on 31st October 2016. of Income Tax (Central) and Director of Income Tax (Investigation) at Mumbai.



- Lewis Hamilton outpaced Mercedes team-mate NicoRosberg to win the 2016 Mexican Grand Prix.
- MiroslavKlose, the top scorer in World Cup history, is ending his playing career and will join Joachim Löw's coaching staff as he studies for his pro licence, the German football association (DFB) have confirmed.

- Satnam Singh, who became the first Indian to be drafted into the NBA when he was selected 52nd overall by the Dallas Mavericks in the 2015 NBA Draft, represents the Texas Legends, the minor league affiliate of the Dallas Mavericks.
- In a bid to boost ties with India, the Australian government on 02nd November 2016 has announced 19 grants worth \$6,30,000 dollars for several projects in the field of education, science, sports, arts and culture.
- The successful grants include an exchange between TAFE NSW and India's Centurion University to share expertise for training indigenous learners, collaboration between University of New South Wales and Indian scientists to develop effective new water purification systems for the country's water supply.
- ↓ ICICI Bank has launched a credit facility against home loans for salaried customers. The Home Overdraft facility will enable a salaried customer to seek loans up to Rs. 1 crore for personal needs against his/her property.
- The joint military training exercise "Sampriti-2016" has been conducted between India and Bangladesh at Tangail, Dhaka, Bangladesh from 05 to 18 November 2016.
- Leading global professional network LinkedIn has signed an agreement with the human resource development ministry to create more job opportunities for Indian students.
- Ministry of Railways has appointed Dr. Bindeshwar Pathak, the founder of Sulabh International, as a Brand Ambassador for Swachh Rail Mission.
- Renowned South Korean director Im Kwon Taek will be honoured with the Lifetime Achievement Award at the upcoming 47th International Film Festival of India (IFFI) in Goa.
- ↓ Indian actress Rekha will be honoured by the upcoming Dubai International Film Festival with a Lifetime Achievement Award.
- ♣ South Korea's presidential office named a new prime minister and finance minister. Kim Byong-joon, a senior former presidential secretary is expected to replace Hwang Kyo-ahn as prime minister. The Blue House named Financial Services Commission Chairman Yim Jong-yong as finance minister and deputy prime minister.
- Indian shuttler Pratul Joshi has won the men's singles title of the Bahrain International Challenge badminton tournament.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi has inaugurated the Asian Ministerial Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction in New Delhi. The Aim of the 3-day conference is to find ways for better management of disaster risk.



- ♣ The Centre, along with state-run power entities NTPC, REC and PFC, will soon launch a USD 2 billion clean energy equity fund to support the government's ambitious target of adding 175 GW renewable energy generation capacity by 2022.
- The second edition of its three-day National Children's Film Festival (NCFF), with the theme of "Make in India", has been held in Jaipur from November 14, coinciding with the Children's Day.
- ♣ Maharashtra is the first state in the country to have a cyber police station in each district simultaneously. The state is converting 42 state-of-the-art cyber crime labs into police stations.
- ↓ 7th Session of the Conference of Parties (COP7) to World Health Organization, WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control (FCTC) has been held from 7th to 12th of this month at Greater Noida.
- GST Council approved a four-tier GST tax structure of 5%, 12%, 18% and 28%, with lower rates for essential items and the highest for luxury and de-merits goods that would also attract an additional cess. Goods and Services Tax is a proposed system of indirect taxation in India merging most of the existing taxes into single system of taxation.
- Minister of Railways Shri Suresh Prabhakar Prabhu has inaugurated the International Conference on Decarbonisation of Indian Railways Mission Electrification in New Delhi on November 3, 2016. It was organised by Institution of Railways Electrical Engineer (IREE) in partnership with ASSOCHAM India.
- ♣ Former Jammu and Kashmir Deputy Chief Minister Mangat Ram Sharma died, after a prolonged illness. He was 85 years old.
- ♣ President Pranab Mukherjee has approved the 2% hike in Dearness Allowance to central government employees, a move that could benefit 50.68 lakh employees and 54.24 lakh pensioners. DA is provided to employees and pensioners to minimise the impact of price rise on their earnings.
- → Paris climate change agreement, the first ever deal involving all the world's nations in the battle against global warming, came into force. The deal seeks commitments to cap the use of fossil fuels like coal and oil. Currently, the deal is backed by 97 countries that are collectively responsible for nearly 67.5% of the global greenhouse gas emissions.
- China has selected historical-adventure film Xuanzang, which co-stars Bollywood actor Sonu Sood, as its official entry for the 89th Academy Awards. The project is a part of the three-film agreement signed between India and China.





- ♣ India's Private sector lender Yes Bank has launched "Yes Mobile 2.0". The app will allow customers to undertake most transactions on the app including Net Banking registration, thereby eliminating the need to visit the website or a banking branch.
- ♣ An Indian lawyer won an election in the United Nations General Assembly for membership to its top body of legal experts. 33-year-old Aniruddha Rajput is among the 34 individuals elected by the General Assembly as members of the International Law Commission.
- American multinational technology company, Google has tied up with Archaeological Survey of India for 360degree virtual tour of 280-odd monuments across the country.
- Legendary Sri Lankan singer and composer Pandit Amaradeva, recipient of many international honours, including Padma Shri, for his contribution to music, after a heart attack. He was 88.
- The 128th anniversary of Nobel laureate and Bharat Ratna Sir CV Raman is being celebrated on 07th November 2016.
- Odisha Government has signed an MoU with the Software Technology Parks of India (STPI) for setting up of four more centres in the State.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate the first ever International Agro-biodiversity Congress, IAC in New Delhi
- The U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) and Mumbai-based RBL Bank announced a new loan portfolio guarantee that will facilitate up to \$75 million for lending to small and medium enterprises (SMEs) operating in off-grid, solar rooftops, and energy efficiency sectors.
- Government has slapped a nearly 10,000 crore rupee fine on Reliance Industries Limited (RIL) and its partners BP and Niko for pumping out gas that flowed to the Krishna Godavari-D6 Block from an adjoining field owned by ONGC.
- In view of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of nurturing entrepreneurship, Confederation of Indian Industry has launched a unique platform called 'Startup Mentorship Circle' to help in connecting start-ups with the global marketplace.
- India and Sri Lanka have signed an agreement under which a hotline will be set up between officials of the two countries to address the fishermen crisis.

- National Security Advisors of India and Japan held bilateral consultations in New Delhi. During their discussions.
- In Boxing, Manny Pacquiao reclaims the World Boxing Organisation (WBO) welterweight title for the third time.
- ♣ Indian Women's hockey team has lifted the Asian Champions Trophy 2016 in Singapore. In a thrilling summit clash, India defeated China 2-1.
- Bollywood actor Ranveer Singh has been named the first Indian ambassador for Switzerland Tourism. Mr. Singh will now be in charge of promoting Switzerland Tourism's campaign for 2017 "Nature wants you back!"
- ← Czech Republic's Petra Kvitova has won the 2016 WTA Elite Singles Trophy. She defeated Ukrainian Elina Svitolina 6-4, 6-2 to grab the title at Zhuhai, China.
- ♣ The Reserve Bank has appointed M Rajeshwar Rao as Executive Director (ED) following G Mahalingam's voluntary retirement from the central bank.
- The Indian army has successfully completed its task of laying an irrigation pipeline in the Demchok region of Eastern Ladakh. The project was being conducted under the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme to link the villages in the region with a hot spring.
- The Union Government launched Pradhan Mantri Surakshit Matritva Abhiyan to provide free health check-ups to pregnant women at government health centres and hospitals.
- ♣ The Reserve Bank of India has issued the Clarifications on hedging for External Commercial Borrowings (ECB). The Clarifications were issued under section 10(4) and 11(1) of the Foreign Exchange Management Act, 1999.
- → BJP Vice President Avinash Rai Khanna is all set to be appointed as a member of National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) by a high-level selection panel headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi clearing his name. He will be the first active politician to be appointed as a member of NHRC.
- The latest Grant Thornton International Business Report for the July-September quarter has placed India 2nd on the global scale for business optimism. During the April-June 2016 period, India was ranked at the third position after being on top for two consecutive quarters. Indonesia took the top spot, with the Philippines coming in third.
- ♣ Vice President of India, M. Hamid Ansari released book 'An Era of Darkness: The British Empire in India' authored by Dr. Shashi Tharoor.
- ♣ India's first liquefied natural gas-driven bus has been launched in Kerala. Union Petroleum and Natural Gas Minister Dharmendra Pradhan and Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan jointly flagged off the first pilot run ecofriendly bus.

- Corporation Bank has signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with the Indian Army on the defence salary package.
- Janet Reno, the first woman to be appointed as Attorney General of US, passed away as a consequence of Parkinson's disease. She was 78.
- Union Finance Minister Arun Jaitley has announced that the new series of 500 and 2,000 rupees notes will be available in banks and post-offices from today and assured that there will be adequate availability of the new notes in the coming days.



Economic Affairs Secretary Shaktikanta Das has announced that the government will unveil Rs. 1,000



- notes with a new colour combination and design in a few months.
- The Government has warned that the cash deposits above 2 lakh 50 thousands rupees threshold under the 50-day window can attract tax plus a 200 percent penalty in case of income mismatch, said Revenue Secretary Hashmukh Adhia.
- The two -day BRICS Communication Minister's Second meeting chaired by Minister of State for Communication Manoj Sinha has held in Bengaluru.
- Tata sons has appointed Ishaat Hussain as chairman of Tata Consultancy Services in place of Cyrus Mistry who was sacked last month
- ♣ A record number of 4 Indian-Americans were elected to the US. Among the winners was two-term attorney general from California Kamala Harris, and Pramila Jayapal, the first Indian-American woman to be elected to the House of Representatives.
- In a big loss to Twitter, the company's Chief Operating Officer (COO) Adam Bain who was in charge of the microblogging website's revenue business, has decided to leave the company.
- China has launched a navigation satellite, which will conduct in-orbit experiments using pulsar detectors to demonstrate new technologies.
- Uttarakhand Chief Minister Harish Rawat has conferred the Uttarakhand Ratna award on his arch rival and former chief minister Narayan Dutt Tiwari on the occasion of the state's 17th foundation day (09th November 2016).
- ♣ The 1st International Agro-biodiversity Congress that was held in New Delhi from 6 November to 9 November 2016 concluded with the adoption of Delhi Declaration on Agrobiodiversity Management. The event saw the participation of 900 participants from 60 countries.
- Gurumoorthy Mahalingam took charge as full-Time Member of SEBI.

- Former world number one Roger Federer won the Stefan Edberg Sportsmanship Award at the ATP awards for the



12th time in his career. The award is given to players who display the "spirit of the sport" on the court.

- India has signed a historic civilian nuclear deal with Japan during the annual bilateral summit held in Tokyo. India is the first non-member of the non-proliferation treaty (NPT) to have signed such a deal with Japan.
- World Pneumonia Day is observed across the world on 12 November. This year theme is, "Keep the Promise, Stop Pneumonia Now".
- ♣ 11 year old Pune girl AnvitaPrashantTelang has been named national winner of the "Doodle 4 Google" contest.
- ♣ TAFE, the world's third largest tractor maker, in collaboration with the Rajasthan government, is setting up a Centre of Excellence — 'JFarm Rajasthan' — and a Custom Hiring Centre in six zones in Rajasthan at a total outlay of Rs.970 crore.
- ♣ Virat Kohli has became the first Indian Test skipper to be out hit wicket since LalaAmarnath in 1949 after his foot disturbed the stumps in the ongoing Rajkot Test against England.
- Leonard Cohen, the baritone-voiced Canadian singersongwriter who seamlessly blended spirituality and sexuality in songs like Hallelujah, Suzanne and Bird on a Wire, has died at age 82.
- Indian women's carrom team defeated Sri Lanka to win the gold at the seventh World carrom championship in Birmingham (UK).
- Children's Day, the day of celebration of childhood, is celebrated on 14th November every year, as a mark to the birth date of our first Prime Minister Pt.Jawaharlal Nehru.
- The World Diabetes Day is observed across the world on 14 November. The theme for this year is "Eyes on Diabetes".
- ♣ A State Bank of India branch in Bhopal has rolled out the first set of newly issued Rs 500 currency notes.
- An Indian-origin man Imtiaz Sooliman from South Africa was awarded the Global Citizen Award for his "innovative and visionary" contribution to the global community.
- ♣ The International Monetary Fund has approved a threeyear \$12 billion loan program for Egypt, the largest such package to a Middle East nation.
- The India-China Joint Training Exercise "Hand in Hand 2016" is scheduled to be held in Pune from November 15-27.
- Narinder Batra has become the first Indian to be elected the President of the International Hockey Federation.
- ↓ India will preside the eighth edition of the Conference of Parties (COP) to WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control (FCTC) which will be held in Switzerland's Geneva in 2018.
- Commerce and Industry Minister Nirmala Sitharaman and Bhutan's Economic Affairs Minister Tengye Lyonpo Lekey Dorji has signed a new bilateral trade agreement



- on 12th November to enhance trade between the two countries through trade facilitation by improving procedures.
- ♣ Aditi Ashok is an Indian professional golfer who has scripted history on November 13th as she became the first Indian woman to win a Ladies European Tour title by clinching the Hero Women's Indian Open.
- The moon arrived at its closest point to the Earth since 1948. The 'supermoon' reached its brightest in Asia on 14 November 2016. The Moon was closest, only 2 lakh 21 thousand 524 miles (356509 km) away at 11:21 GMT.
- To oversee recalibration of ATM machines after the country introduced new banknotes to replace old 500 rupee and 1,000 rupee notes, RBI will set up a task force under Deputy Governor SS Mundra. Panel will provide "direction and guidance" for recalibrating ATM machines to dispense the new notes.
- As part of its efforts to continue the global transition to zero-and-low carbon energy sources, the United States (US) has announced two financial projects worth 95 million US dollars for India.
- ♣ The 2016 Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation Leaders Week kicked off 14th November in Lima, Peru.
- ♣ Private sector lender YES Bank has appointed Amresh Acharya as Group President and Head of Global Indian Banking.
- Federal Bank, India's major commercial bank in the private sector has received RBI's permission to open its first international branch at the Dubai International Financial Centre.
- ♣ Hollywood actor Jackie Chan received his little gold statuette, an honorary Oscar for his decades of work in film at the annual Governors Awards.
- ♣ Thiruvananthapuram has been termed as the country's breast cancer capital, with cases at a record high of 40 per lakh of population. 9 lakh women are diagnosed with breast cancer every year.
- Indian golfer SSP Chawrasia clinched the \$1 million (Rs. 6.8 crore) Resorts World Manila Masters in the Philippines, his first ever Asian Tour title outside India.
- ♣ The moon arrived at its closest point to the Earth since 1948. The 'supermoon' reached its brightest in Asia on 14 November 2016.
- As part of its efforts to continue the global transition to zero-and-low carbon energy sources, the United States (US) has announced two financial projects worth 95 million US dollars for India.
- The government has announced that it will present the Union Budget for 2017-18 on February 1, 2017 and the budget session may begin in January.

which will see participation of over 150 companies from 27 countries.

- India and Israel have inked two agreements in the field of water resources management and agriculture. The agreements were signed following delegation level talks between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and visiting Israeli President Reuven Rivlin in New Delhi.
- Meghalaya became the first state to start India's first Cherry Blossom Festival on 14 Nov, 2016, which is widely celebrated in Japan.
- Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar has launched a key programme to provide free electricity connection to about 50 lakh households above the poverty line. The chief minister launched "Har Ghar Bijli Lagataar" programme, which was key development thrust for the Assembly polls.
- Bulgaria's prime minister Boyko Borisov has handed in his resignation to parliament after his party's candidate Tsetska Tsacheva, failed to win the country's presidential election on November 14, 2016.
- ♣ The Asian Development Bank (ADB) and the Government of India on 15 November 2016 signed a 500 million US dollar loan to build a 9.8 km long road bridge across the Ganges River. This will be India's longest river bridge.
- Netherlands-based doctors have performed the first-ever brain implant on a 58-year-old woman paralysed by Lou Gehrig's disease, enabling her to communicate in day-to-day life via a speech computer.
- Cyrus Mistry was voted out as chairman on 15th November by the board of the Tata Global Beverages. Harish Bhat, a non-executive director, has been appointed chairman of the company.
- Mota Singh, an Indian-origin Sikh, who became UK's firstever ethnic minority judge to sit on the English Bench wearing a turban instead of a horse-hair wig, died.
- Actor-turned-author Twinkle Khanna launched her second book titled 'The Legend of Lakshmi Prasad'. Twinkle's first book was 'Mrs Funnybones: She's Just Like You and a Lot Like Me', which was published in 2015.
- President Vladimir Putin has signed an executive order removing Russia's signature from the International Criminal Court's founding treaty on 16th November. Russia in 2000 signed the Rome treaty that established the Hague-based court but never ratified it.
- The Unique Identification Authority of India has launched a revamped version of its toll-free helpline number 1947. The number is revamped to handle more incoming calls.
- Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir Mehbooba Mufti has launched the Jhelum-Tawi Flood Recovery project on November 14, 2016, for which World Bank has funded an amount of US \$250 million (Rs. 1,600 crore).
- ♣ Maharashtra has become the first state to adopt Fly Ash Utilisation Policy, paving way for prosperity by



- generating "wealth from waste", and environment protection.
- ♣ Pakistan's Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif has inaugurated a trade route linking the south western Gwadar port to Kashgar city in China as part of \$46 billion project to jumpstart economic growth in the South Asian country.
- Reliance Group has partnered with Cisco Jasper for the launch of a venture called Unlimit, which will provide Internet of Things (IoT) services to its enterprise customers in India.
- 4 A team of women commandos has been inducted for the first time in Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) to counter Naxal insurgency in Jharkhand.
- → The Defense Research and Development Organization (DRDO) has successfully tested its unmanned combat aerial vehicle, Rustom-2. The medium-altitude long endurance (MALE) category vehicle met all the expectations during the first flight.
- ♣ Debbie Hockley has been elected as president of New Zealand Cricket, becoming the first woman to hold this role in the 122-year history of New Zealand Cricket's national governing body.
- The 6th Indo-China joint training exercise Hand- in- Hand 2016 commenced at the parade ground in Aundh Military Camp, Pune. The exercise will finish on 27 November 2016.
- Chhattisgarh has become the first state to adopt a resolution welcoming the demonetization of high-value currency notes.
- ♣ Prime Minister of the Republic of Mauritius Anirood Jugnauth has inaugurated an AYUR Herbarium project in North Goa, an initiative by the pharmaceutical major in association with Union AYUSH Ministry.
- → Times Internet, the digital arm of The Times of India group appointed former Twitter India head Rishi Jaitly as the chief executive officer (CEO) of Times Global Partners, a group initiative that supports the launch and expansion of emerging global digital companies in India.
- Haryana sprinter Dharambir Singh, who was barred from representing the country in the Rio Olympics at the last minute for failing a dope test, has been slapped an eightyear ban by the National Anti-Doping Agency.


